
Hot Off the Presses

And now a brief update on how my new novel is progressing. As I've mentioned several times, progress is slow. The reasons are many, but health issues have played a significant role in slowing me down. After suffering a relatively mild heart attack in June 2023, I was simply knackered (as our UK friends might say) and spent many months in somewhat of a fog as a stew of medications interacted to scramble my thoughts. I eventually managed to eke out the balance of A Law Unto Itself, which was well underway at the time. Book Number 9 has been more of a struggle as I didn't have a relatively fully plotted story to build on as I recovered. As you might imagine, it's well-nigh impossible to make steady progress on a novel when your recollection of what you wrote last week grows fuzzy. At any rate, things have been mostly sorted out and I'm getting back on track, albeit more slowly than I might have hoped. The good news is that I'm fine physically, so the finished novel is simply a waiting game. I am, however, proving to be readily capable of cooking up new story ideas and have established something of a story backlog. Now, the trick will be to get them all down on paper...

What's Neil Reading?

The upside of having time on my hands has been the wealth of reading time to binge read a few authors and/or series that caught my eye. Aside from the pure joy I get from reading, this also allows me to steer you to outstanding fiction while you wait for me to finally publish

again! David Baldacci is a modern thriller writer I enjoy, so the chance to delve into his Will Robie series was a treat. Here are my thoughts about this five-book series, consisting of the novels *The Innocent, The Hit, The Target, The Guilty,* and *End Game:*

"I'm not a particularly big fan of stories celebrating government assassins (or any other type of assassin). I am, however, a big fan of David Baldacci, so I decided to give the first book of his Will Robie series a try. I should have seen the result coming: a binge read of the entire five-novel series. CIA assassin Will Robie and fellow CIA killer Jessica Reel are as lethal as killers get, but I appreciate that

Baldacci doesn't depict them as heroic jingoistic automatons for whom a twinge of conscience is an afterthought. Robie and Reel are highly skilled and their mission planning is fascinating, but what humanizes the characters and makes them interesting to me is their intelligence and emotional depth. Over the course of five books, the Robie and Reel evolving character arcs reveal them to be damaged people who cling to a very particular sense of honor that keeps them somewhat centered. Each of the books in this series is a tautly written thriller in its own right; the series overall is an admirable accomplishment. If you like intelligent, character-driven action thrillers, David Baldacci has a treat for you in the Will Robie series."


